
It is good that we are here sharing in one faith, one church, and one Body of Christ.

# Little Brown Church Celebrates 125 years

"WE ARE A PEOPLE OF FAITH IN JESUS CHRIST, OPEN TO ALL, AND BY FOLLOWING HIS TEACHINGS WE WILLINGLY SERVE GOD, OUR NEIGHBORS, AND EACH OTHER THROUGH WORSHIP, FELLOWSHIP AND MINIS-TRY." (Mission statement).

And so we have attempted every day for 125 years to live up through words and action to the mission statement. We have sponsored Sunday Schools both in Albany and on the West Side Road in our earliest years of 1886 & 1887. We have sponsored veterans groups during both world wars. Ladies organizations such as the Ladies Social Circle, the King's Daughters and the Litahni were responsible for endless good deeds. We have had a Men's Club as well as for married couples - the Congo Club. The sanctuary has been the home to the American Red Cross, Alcoholics Anonymous, the Grange, the Eleta Kindergarten and later the Day School. Scouts of all ages have met there. In the 1980's a food pantry was established that has provided hundred of thousands of meals. The Dinner Bell perhaps is the most visible sign of our willingness to serve God through helping others. Recently Brian Wiggins we have rejuvenated Bible Study and Vacation Bible School - the latter an ecumenical endeavor of several

parishes. Always known for its fine spiritual music, our services have been greatly enhanced with the Chancel Choir, The Sunbeam Choir and sacred dance. Frequently our Youth Groups have been involved with service to the church and to the community. The 125th celebration on August 28th, provides our 200+ members a way to express thanks to all who have been a part of our organization and to hopefully bring in individuals to help us in the future. We are expecting many former pastors and their families on this special day as well as many former parishioners from far away. We hope to see you too!
