Diaconate

The Diaconate of the CVCC has worked diligently this year with Martell to promote meaningful and fulfilling experiences for worship, prayer and praise of God for our congregation and community. We are thankful for Martell's dedication and expertise in bringing our church "back" to God and to the Bible. Your Diaconate has welcomed your insights and suggestions this year that have lead us to initiate a more contemporary service once a month, a change in our format for communion, initiation of Prayer Cards that inform our congregation of prayer needs, and the introduction of the New Revised Standard Bible to enhance and facilitate your personal prayer and Bible study. We continue to offer these Bibles for your purchase.

During each Sunday of the Lenten season this year, we invited the congregation to participate in, and to experience different types of communion. We also coordinated the decoration of the sanctuary for each season. The Diaconate has worked with Martell to plan Lenten services and the supper, and the family and candlelight Christmas Eve services. We have participated in worship services through readings, and assisting with communion, and have worked with Roger to coordinate our musical program with the lectionary each month. Throughout the year, the Diaconate has orchestrated monthly services at Mineral springs, and has supported special worship

services with other area churches. The Diaconate is also responsible for maintenance of the CVCC membership list, and has reached out to individuals via letters, phone calls, and visits to encourage participation and involvement in the life of our church. We have also visited and made calls to members and friends of the Church who have been ill or hospitalized, as well as those who have been homebound, or in need. In addition, we have organized receptions after funerals and memorial services.

The Diaconate continues to coordinate ushers for all services, Coffee Fellowship hosts/hostesses, and the organization of flowers for Sunday services. Special thanks to Marcia Hill for her efforts with the flowers this year! Thanks also to all who have served as ushers and/or Coffee Fellowship hosts and sponsors this year!

We look forward to an exciting 2013 spiritual journey for the CVCC.

Trustees

The trustees have been meeting on a monthly basis or more often as needed during the past year. Although there are several facets of our church life that fall under the domain of the Trustees, our main concern seems to be maintaining the fiscal stability of the church.

For the past several years our annual budget required substantial withdrawals from the endowment in order to remain current with our financial obligations. We have responded to such nuisance calls as: the pipes are frozen and there's no water, there are basement windows that are broken, the furnace isn't running, our insurance has been cancelled to less urgent calls to replace light bulbs all of which require attention.

Each year we discuss ways we can begin to catch up with the many deferred maintenance items that require attention. From the improvement we would like to see in the sanctuary, to the repair of the roof, replacing and painting the shingles; additional parking that would help to eliminate much of street parking. We have talked about a major gift campaign to accomplish many of these things, but then we look at the annual budget shortfall and realize that trying to raise \$100K-\$200K in addition to the annual budget-

ary requirements would be futile. We are planning to submit proposals to local foundations who may decide to support some of our capital needs, especially maintaining our historic building.

While we all realize our membership is a graying and that it has diminished over the past several years we all need to be positive and vigorous in our support of our church, however that support falls. Let us all project that Yankee Spirit and make it become a contagious happening in our community.

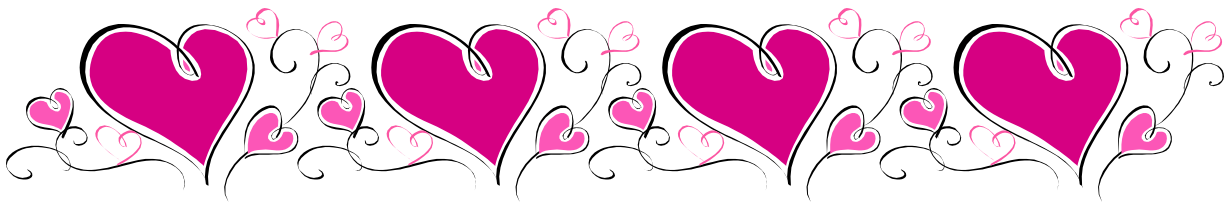
